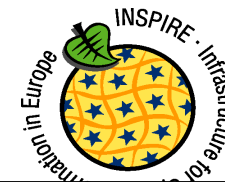


- **Preparatory phase (2004-2006)**

The Implementing Rules on Metadata: the full story



- Call for experts March 2005
- Drafting Teams established in October 2005
- Draft IR for Metadata published on 2nd Feb. 2007 based on requirement of Directive, review of existing material submitted by SDICS and LMOs, international standards, and drafting team knowledge.
- Open for comments by SDICs and LMOs over an 8 week period. 1200 comments received.
- DT analyzed comments and made recommendations to Commission in August 2007.
- Commission prepared its own draft proposal based on inputs received, open for public consultation in October 2007 for 8 weeks
- Interservice consultation 14/3 – 9/4/2008
- **Unanimous positive opinion of the INSPIRE Committee on 14th May 2008**



Metadata Implementing Rules



- Result of extensive collaborative work between Drafting Team, Commission, and stakeholders through 2005-07.
- Proposal for a Regulation unanimously approved by INSPIRE Regulatory Committee on 14/5/2008.
- European Parliament completed its scrutiny on 18/6/2008. Formal adoption by the Commission now started.
- Expected adoption Summer 2008.



Key features



- Focus on Discovery and elements needed to implement the requirements of the Directive and allow interoperability through standards
- Non-binding guidelines that allow conformance with EN ISO 19115 (data) and EN ISO 19119 (services) + interoperability with e-government through ISO 15836.
- Technical coherence with standards tested with MD on-line Editor freely available via EU Geoportal

IRs on the interoperability and harmonisation of spatial data sets and services



- The development of INSPIRE Implementing rules for the interoperability and, where practicable, harmonisation of spatial data sets and services follow a two-step approach:
 - Development of conceptual framework and specification methodology:
 - Definition of Annex Themes and Scope
 - Generic Conceptual Model (GCM),
 - Methodology for Specification Development.
 - Guidelines for Encoding
 - Development of data specifications for each data theme based on the
 - conceptual framework
 - common specification development methodology
 - and on the INSPIRE roadmap

IRs on Network services



- An INSPIRE Architecture is proposed to integrate INSPIRE services, e-commerce and DRM components,
- INSPIRE services shall be Web Services (W3C) using the SOAP protocol to exchange messages, and WSDL language to describe the services

How IRs (will) look like?



- EC Regulations (even if other forms could be possible)
- Deadline for implementation set in the INSPIRE Directive or directly in the legal act
- Published, as the Directive, on the OJ in all official languages
- If Regulations, directly applicable without transposition into National legislation
- Distinction between proper legal act and accompanying guidelines
- Taking into account as much as possible (but avoiding formal binding to) evolving standards



Relationships between Implementing Rules and guidelines



- Balance required between
 - High level of detail to guarantee interoperability
 - Flexibility to quickly fix things that don't work without having to go through the Regulatory Process
- Distinguish between IRs and guidelines
 - IRs (legally binding) to focus on stable elements (What to do)
 - Guidelines to provide the implementation details (How to do)
- Decision on what becomes part of legal text, and what will become guidelines is responsibility of Commission
- Decision will be made in consultation with Drafting Teams and Thematic Working Groups
- Guidelines will be published as official documents by the Commission



Standards



- Commission maintains strong liaison relationship with CEN/TC 287, ISO/TC 211, and OGC
- European Committee for Standardisation (CEN) can support IR development process by adopting relevant standards and Technical Reports
 - Potential role for CEN/TC 287 identified in INSPIRE Work Programme 2007-2009
 - CEN/TC 287 has welcomed this role (e.g., business plan, resolution 124 to support work of INSPIRE, 143 to establish an Ad hoc group on metadata for discovery)
- European Committee for Standardisation (CEN) may turn guidelines into European standards



The INSPIRE transposition



- Deadline: 15 May 2009
- Most countries already preparing legal acts to be submitted to National Parliaments
- Accompanying measures from the EC:
 - Workshop on the Legislative Transposition of the INSPIRE Directive, 15-16 April 2008
 - Advice on request on transposition issues
 - This Conference ...
